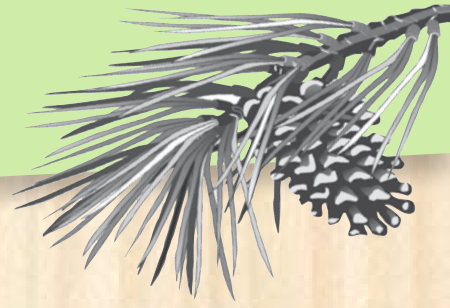


Forestry: A Career To Explore
